7-Day Academy

You're curious about telling stories that go beyond content?

You want your work to feel more intentional?

Not louder — but clearer, more human, more meaningful.

Turning knowledge into stories is a skill rarely taught.

This workshop is a space to explore it and gives you the opportunity to screen your first documentary at a public mini film festival.

What makes this workshop different

❖ **It's designed around time, not speed.**

This is a focused, week-long learning experience. Space, presence, and continuity are part of the process — not extras.

❖ **It's grounded in understanding, not trends.**

Stories are developed from research, reflection, and clarity. Not from algorithms, formats, or shortcuts.

❖ **It's fully hands-on.**

You'll move through the entire creative process — from early ideas to a finished piece — with guidance at every step.

❖ **It's small and shared by design.**

Learning happens in a group setting through conversation, feedback, and mutual support — not competition.

❖ **It's about learning, not performing.**

No prior skills, special equipment, or finished message are required. Curiosity and openness are enough.

❖ **It takes place in an environment that supports focus.**

Baja Station offers distance from everyday noise — allowing learning and creativity to unfold naturally.

❖ **It ends with a shared moment.**

The week concludes with a public film screening at Baja Station — a space to share your work, reflect, and celebrate the process together.

What we'll work on together

❖ **Impact-driven creativity**

Develop a clear vision and learn how to create with intention — without rushing outcomes.

❖ **Science-based storytelling**

Explore how research, knowledge, and lived experience can become clear, human narratives.

❖ **Editing & emotional architecture**


Understand rhythm, pacing, and flow — and how small decisions shape the viewer's experience.

❖ **Production mindset & organization**

Learn how to structure, plan, and move your project forward — from first idea to final film.

❖ **Sharing & presentation**

Explore how to present and share your work with clarity and care — across platforms and in live settings.



What a typical day could look like

7:00 AM	Optional sunrise yoga, meditation, or light workout A gentle start to the day — grounded and energized.
8:30 AM	Shared breakfast. Fresh, nourishing food to begin the day together.
9:30 AM	Daily impulse & creative focus Introduction to the theme and intention of the day.
10:30 AM	Deep creative work. Story development, filming, or editing — focused time for your film project.
12:30 PM - 3:30 PM	Lunch & extended break, time to recharge. Swim, surf, snorkel, paddleboard, or simply enjoy the ocean. Whale watching when in season.

or filming during the best light of the day.

7:00 PM




About Baja Station

Baja Station is a small, ocean-side community in Baja California Sur.

A shared space shaped by nature, creativity, and simple living. People come here to slow down, focus, and connect — with their work, with each other, and with the environment around them. Days move between the ocean and creative practice. Shared meals, conversations, music, and time outdoors are part of everyday life.

The place is intentionally simple. No rush. No noise. Space to think, create, and learn.


